EXPECTATIONS: You are expected to attend every class and to pay attention to each lecture. I encourage you to think about the ideas being presented and to ask questions when you are confused about an idea. However, the classroom lecture is only an introduction to the material and is a small portion of the learning experience. You should read the text book and study your notes after each section. You are expected to do the assigned homework after each section to assist in your understanding of the material. You are encouraged to seek help outside of class. This help may come in the form of my office hours and/or use of a private tutor. How much (or little) of the above work that you do will determine how good (or bad) your grade will be.

GRADING: The final grade will be based on the accumulation of points from the following:

1. **Exams (20% each):** There will be three 90-minute in-class exams. These are scheduled for 5/27, 6/3, and 6/11. Each exam will be worth 20% of your final grade.
2. **Quizzes (15%):** There will be quizzes given daily (about 12 all together). These quizzes may or may not be announced. Each quiz will consist of questions pertaining to the material from at least two class periods prior to the day of the quiz.
3. **Final Exam (25%):** There will be a cumulative final exam, scheduled for Friday, June 13.

MAKE-UP POLICY: Make-up quizzes will not be given under any circumstances, and any missed quiz will receive a zero for a grade. At least one quiz grade will be dropped. As far as exams are concerned, if you have a conflict with one of the exam dates, then you must make arrangements with me ahead of time to re-schedule the exam (eg. if you are participating on a college sports team). If an unforeseen emergency arises, then you must contact me **IMMEDIATELY**. If you can provide documented proof of your emergency, then you will be given a make-up on 6/12. **YOU MUST HAVE DOCUMENTED PROOF TO RECEIVE A MAKE-UP EXAM.** Students are responsible for scheduling these make-ups prior to 6/12.
